- A \$500 Calvin Denis Memorial Scholarship was awarded to Lee Rose who will study wildlife conservation and environmental science at the University of Delaware.

Annexation of the Selbyville Service Area

Earlier this year, the Selbyville-Indian River Lions Club decided that because of diminishing membership and support in the community they would close at the end of June. Our Club tentatively had agreed to annex the Selbyville area, as well as the Indian River High School, subject to board approval. Similarly, the Lord Baltimore Lions Club tentatively agreed to annex the Dagsboro and Frankford portion of the old Selbyville-Indian River Lions Club.

Our board unanimously agreed to this on May 26th and it is my understanding that the Lord Baltimore board embraced this annexation at their meeting on May 27th.

On June 1st a delegation of board members met with the Selbyville Town Council to inform them of the change. This effort was warmly received and the Coastal Point newspaper covered this event in a very positive way and the Mayor of Selbyville was quoted as saying: *"We are the ones who should be honored. The Lions Club is a great organization. They have been around here for a long time and it is great to have people stepping up to see that it stays around."*

This year our Club will have a booth at the Selbyville Old Timers Day. This event includes an antique car, truck, tractor and police car show. We will be selling hot dogs, sodas, water and thanks to Club member John DelVecchio, we will also be offering his homemade pastries. We also will be selling Halloween Parade 50/50 raffle tickets. This should be an enjoyable event and it will provide a nice opportunity for us to be seen for the first time as the Lions Club serving the Selbyville Area. A nice opportunity to recruit some new members! Regardless of whether you will be working that day or not, we hope you will support the Town of Selbyville and our efforts.

Territorial Dispute

At a November 2008 Lions Zone meeting, VDG Lee Bird requested that all Clubs within the District agree on service area maps. At the same meeting, a Lord Baltimore representative presented what they represented as a 1997 Sussex County map on which service area boundaries had been superimposed and agreed upon.

A subsequent review of that map revealed discrepancies between it and founding documents of our Club. When these discrepancies were brought to the attention of those attending a subsequent Zone meeting, the
