FENWICK ISLAND LIONS CLUB HISTORY

The Fenwick Island Lions Club was chartered November 21, 1986, by Lions Clubs International. Our club started with 38 charter members and is, indeed, fortunate to have six (6) of these first members still enthusiastically supporting club activities. The FILC was started by Lion Noble Simpson with strong membership support by Lion Charles Angle and was sponsored by the Lord Baltimore Lions Club. During our Charter Day celebration on January 10, 1987, over two hundred (200) persons were in attendance at Harpoon Hanna's Restaurant, where we meet to this day.

Over the intervening years, we have supported the following major categories of giving and/or personal service, including but not limited to: *Meals on Wheels, College Scholarships, Melvin Jones, Campaign SightFirst & SightFirst II, Lion Vision Research Foundation, Lions Eye Bank (DE Valley), Delaware Lions Foundation, the Pyle Center*, contributions to families burned out of their homes; ramp building for the infirm, and glasses and cataract operations for those in need. Other important activities receiving contributions of time and money over the years include: *Leader Dog Program, diabetes (juvenile and adult), Special Olympics, Fenwick Island sand chair, beach cleaning, dune grass planting, Delaware Sight & Hearing, drug awareness programs, the Lower Sussex Little League programs, the establishment and continued support for a local Indian River High School Lions Leo Club as well as emergency giving for the needy in our community.*

Our financial aid and service activities are supported by Club fund raising projects, including but not limited to: collection of aluminum cans, annual Fall Spaghetti Dinner & a Spring Pancake Breakfast and assorted raffles. Our club is one of the largest Lions Clubs in our state. High Club membership affords a Lions Club the opportunity for increased additional service projects and financial support to the community.

In 2009, our service area expanded to include Selbyville, Roxana and South Bethany. This larger area provided an opportunity for increased visibility and service to the communities. For the first time, we oversaw and coordinated the Selbyville Halloween Parade, as well as participated in the Selbyville Old Timers Day. We participated in the Roxana Volunteer Fire Department's 50th Anniversary Celebration and assisted Fenwick Island in its first Old Fenwick Island Days.

Our board placed a greater emphasis on local needs and appointed a new community outreach committee to develop a process to review and handle the increased requests for glasses for students in the two schools in the Selbyville area as well as other local needs such as ramps, visual equipment, etc. And, we continued our commitment as sponsors of the Indian River High School Leo Club, the scholarship program, the youth vision screening program, collecting used eyeglasses and hearing aids, and collecting food for two food pantries. To meet our budget obligations, a very successful Bingo was held at the end of the year to carry forward these projects.

On the social front, we enjoy the Club's traditional annual family picnic, a trip to Salisbury for a Shorebirds baseball game, our Christmas party and the socials/fundraisers at Grottos Pizza.

Each year, the Fenwick Island Lions Club evolves and 'fine tunes' its mission statement of services to others. We are not the same club we were 23 years ago at our founding, nor are we the club we will be in another 10 years. However, there is one common thread throughout, and that is the Club's ability to successfully combine the spirit of service with fun, fellowship and personal satisfaction. Our Club continues as a diverse organization of men and women dedicated to our mission of service to our community. ***We Serve!***

MAJOR COMMITTEE PROGRAMS

There are many important FILC Activities beyond those mentioned in this Directory. We Serve is more than a slogan, it is who we are and it sets a wonderful tone to the activities we pursue and enjoy while having *FUN*. *Major programs, new and old, are discussed below:*

Community Outreach Committee

This is a new committee that was formed to address our new responsibilities for serving a larger territory which now includes Selbyville, Roxana, South Bethany and Fenwick Island in this tough economic time. Such as a recent request, the individual was referred to another Lions Club because he did not live in our service area. This is an example of the importance of this committee.

Lion Dave schedules drivers to deliver hot lunches that are prepared by the Cheer Center to the home-bound people living in the Roxana service area that includes Fenwick Island. FILC has been providing this service for 23 years. There are seventeen faithful Lions and several spouses who make sure these citizens receive their daily meal. 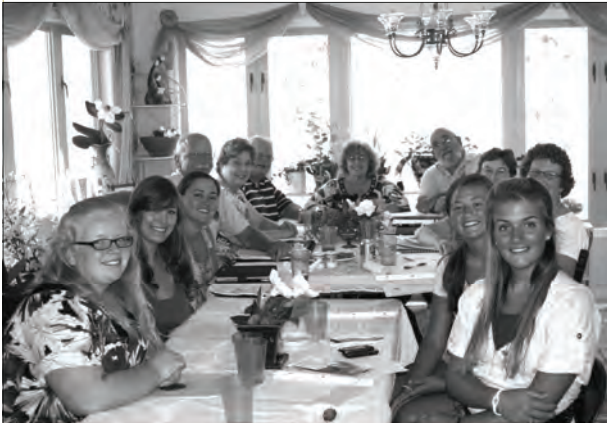

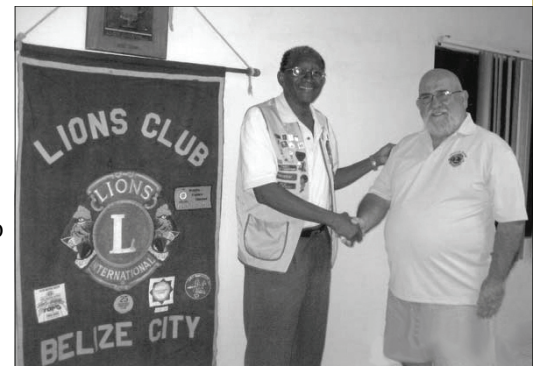

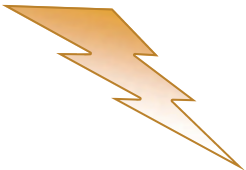
