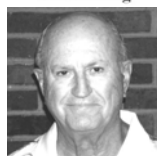

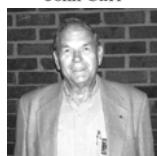

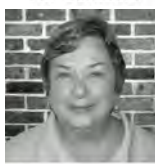

## Major Committee Programs

There are many important FILC Activities beyond those mentioned in this Directory. Some examples include: our Club annual picnic, Beach Clean Up on Dagsboro in Fenwick Island and dune grass planting on the area dunes, the DLF "Walk for Sight" and Auction, the annual trip to a Shorebirds baseball game in Salisbury, our Grotto Pizza night out socials, the Visually Impaired Christmas Party in the District, our own Christmas Party, the annual Scholarship support to Indian River High School students going off to college, special projects like Christmas ornament sales, the FILC Ladies Day Luncheon, you get the point... We Serve is more than a slogan, it is who we are and it sets a wonderful tone to the activities we pursue and enjoy while having *FUN*. *Major programs, new and old, are discussed below:*

### **Community Outreach Committee**

This is a new committee that was formed to address our new responsibilities for serving a larger territory which now includes Selbyville, Roxana, South Bethany and Fenwick Island in this tough economic time. This committee has already received several requests for new eyeglasses. Recently, an elderly lady in Selbyville was approved and received a new pair glasses. In instances where a request comes from out of our area of service we refer that request to the relevant Lions Club. Such as a recent request, the individual was referred to another Lions Club because he did not live in our service area. This is an example of the importance of this committee.

### **Meals on Wheels**

Meals on Wheels program chairman, Dave Crum schedules drivers to deliver hot lunches that are prepared by the Cheer Center to the home-bound people living in the Roxana service area that includes Fenwick Island. FILC has been providing this service for 24 years. There are many faithful Lions, several spouses and Friends of Lions who make sure these citizens receive their daily meal. In addition to the meal, the recipients look forward to having someone taking the time to say "hello" and greeting them with a smile.

## LEO CLUB

After the guests were served they presented each with Angel ornaments made out of feathers. Also, at Christmas they adopt a family and buy gifts for them. In August, they spent time assisting the Lions in parking cars at the Girls Softball World Series in Roxana. In addition, they have joined other Leo's and Lions from around the state to participate in the Delaware Lions Foundation's "Walk for Sight" fundraiser which provides grants to Lions projects and service activities state wide. Last year alone, a total of 62 Leos took part in one or more of eleven different activities throughout the school year and spent just under 400 hours serving their community.

On August 17th, the officers of this year's Indian River High School (IRHS) Leo Club and their advisor Ms. Lonnie Riley joined representatives of our Lions Club at the home of Leo Club liaisons, Lions Jim and Carol Miles, for a pre-season planning meeting. Our club sponsors goal was to provide guidance and direction to the Leo Officers who worked to develop their program for this coming year. Use of the new Leo website, eye glass recycling program and tree planting as potential service projects were also discussed, among other subjects. 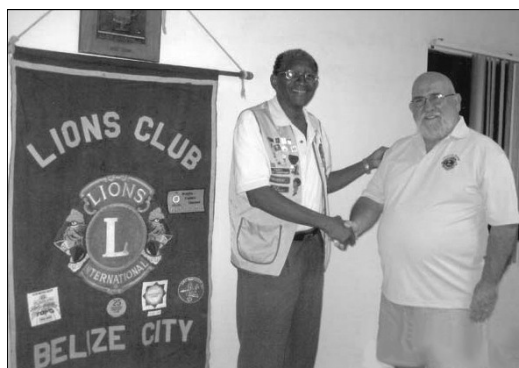

### The Arnall Patz Professorship is Awarded to the founder of our Club, and Past District Governor, Noble Simpson:

At the May 23, 2011 board meeting, the board of directors unanimously voted to support the Arnall Patz Professorship for The Lions Low Vision Center by making a contribution of \$2,500 in the name of the founder of our Club, and a Past District Governor, Noble Simpson.

The Lions Low Vision Center (LVC) at the Wilmer Eye Institute, John Hopkins University Hospital in Baltimore is a Lions Multiple District 22 project. It is sponsored by the five Districts, with over 300 Clubs, that make up Lions Multiple District 22. The LVC is a pioneer in new clinical approaches to and research in low vision rehabilitation, offering the most advanced solutions and comprehensive clinical studies in this area. Visual impairments that cannot be corrected by medication, surgery, lasers, eyeglasses or contact lenses, are know as low vision, which is the third leading cause of disability in the United States.



Dr. Patz himself was a pioneer in this field having done extensive research into retrolental fibroplasias blinding disease of premature infants. He also developed one of the first laser instruments for the treatment of retinal

blood vessel diseases. As Director of the Wilmer Eye Institute, Dr. Patz had a longstanding relationship with Lions Clubs. When he passed away in March, 2010, his family decided that the most meaningful tribute would be to link his name to the Lions through an endowed professorship fund to be held at the Wilmer Eye Institute.

Dr. Patz's former patients, colleagues, students, and friends have come together to honor him with monetary gifts to create the "Arnall Patz, M.D. Professorship for the Lions Low Vision Center." At John Hopkins, endowed professorships are especially important to its mission of teaching, research and service.

The LVC has also established a program whereby with a donation of \$2,500, a club may recognize an individual with an Arnall Patz Fellowship. The board of directors thought it would be a fitting tribute to honor the founder of our club, Noble Simpson, who through his leadership these past 24 years has exemplified the Lions Clubs International mission of service to others.

This fall, our Club will organize a trip to the Wilmer Eye Center so that our members can better appreciate the type research the institute is engaged in and see first-hand examples of the programs designed to improve the lives of the visually impaired and help make them more independent.

Even if you first fail — like the Wright brothers did with their first trial airplanes — a strong belief creates a sense of courage to try things others thought impossible.
