Region 4 Pre-School Vision Screening - 2004-2005 School Year

Although we are still "following-up" with several parents, we felt your Club would be interested in this year's results from the majority of our Region's pre-school vision screening program.

Members of your clubs (39 Lions) took photos of 1016 children from both Zones. From these, two of our Lions, Drs. Jeffrey Hilovsky and Jeanne Murphy-Moore, screened the photos and recommended a further exam for 151 children of this group.

We have now documented, so far, 35 children from the Lion's screening having received glasses or vision treatment.
