

Direct community service "after the Spaghetti Dinner": The day after the Spaghetti Dinner, our very successful fund raiser, we make a list of left over food and decide what to return and what we can donate. Supplies we purchase that are returnable will be returned for full refund. Cooked foods are collected and delivered to a Shelter (Diakonia) in west OC where they can be used to feed those less fortunate than ourselves. This allows us to operate our Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser without any waste. This year we donated about 60LB's of cooked spaghetti, 20 Gals of

spaghetti sauce along with 10 Loaves of bread. We will adjust our supplies next year according to what we used this year.

We also remove the sign in front of the Fenwick Crab House and return it to our storage shed provided by Bruce Bennett (Mini-Storage). Our friends at Keenwick Sound allow us to use their sign to announce our dinner, we return it to storage.
