**OPENING**

<u>ATTENDENCE</u> – twenty-one members and 2 guests were present. Guests were Evelyn (Dan's friend/helper) and Hallie Kroll from the Indian River Life Saving Station.

#### LUNCH WAS SERVED

#### **GUEST SPEAKER**

>There have been lots of shipwrecks

>1785 – 1787 small shacks were built along the shoreline

>every sea town had one boat

>1848 New Jersey was given \$10,000 for Life Saving Efforts

>1865 Civil War....not too much was done during this time

>1871 Federal Government appointed Summer I. Kimball to oversee Life Saving issues

>a total of 13 locations were established, 15 miles apart, with 6-7 men at each station

>the men wore uniforms similar to those they'd worn in the Civil War

>they had Surf Boats, 26 ft. long, weighing 700 to 1,000 lbs., it took 6 men to pull this boat, it could hold up to 15 people

>there was a Beach Cart, 1500 lbs., which could shoot out a line to the ship in trouble there was a Life Car attached called a "Breeches Buoy" which could fit 2 people (it consisted of a large life preserver attached to the line and the preserver had britches inside for your legs to go through) hence the name "Breeches."
>the Beach Patrol men would walk every night North and South and one would stay in the shack
>our Indian River Life Saving Station has existed since 1876 – 1907 when the Coast Guard took over
>ours is one of the oldest Life Saving Stations in operation today, it has been renovated to what you see today
>there have been 62 shipwrecks off our shores, with 419 people saved
>one shipwrecks was of the Red Wing, 6 men died, not from drowning, but because the waves were so bad, their necks broke, killing them

Hallie said there will be a re-enactment of using the Breeches Buoy on August 15<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> at the Indian Rive Life Saving Station.
