Lion Lou says... I really must go! IPP Lion Bob Pretty says... "It's the right thing to do!"



Fenwick Island was well represented at this years Brunch held on Saturday January 14, 2006 at the Dover Sheraton and attended by nine of our Melvin Jones members, Lions Noble Simpson, Bill Neimiller, Bob Pretty, Bill Morison, Luke Martin, Bill Bunting, Don Stewart, Nick Yengle and Mickey Cook.

Fenwick Island LC was recognized as having more active Melvin Jones Members than any club in the District, as a club we are very proud but hope some day to have 100% of our active members in this distinguished group of Lions. This year we will be adding five more Fenwick Lions to the fellowship. This is the most members we have ever added in one year and for this we are grateful. If we keep up our enthusiasm and participation in our projects and they remain profitable our goal might be closer than we think.

Some Melvin Jones Facts:

The following was taken from IPDG Doug Carey's LCIF report and Council Chair Don LeCates speech at the brunch: Last year District 22-D gave \$45,000 to LCIF, from 7/1/05 through 12/31/05 we have given \$26,453. In the last 10 years Multiple District-22 has received \$1,093,000 from LCI.

District 22-D has 595 Melvin Jones Fellows of which 50 are Progressive Melvin Jones Fellows, the 1st Melvin Jones fellow in 22-D PID Ralph Helm in 1979 and he had 9 diamond progressive awards.

By Club, the following LC's had the most Melvin Jones Fellows: Wilmington Manor Lions Club 38 MJF and Fenwick Island Lions Club 37 MJF. The youngest MJF is Lion Sierra Spicer

Through LCIF and the Sight First program: We Lions have restored sight to 4.6 million people through cataract surgeries. We've prevented serious vision loss for 20 million people. We've built or expanded 207 eye hospitals/clinics/wards, upgraded 314 eye centers with equipment, and provided management training for 92 facilities.

We've now embarked on Campaign Sight First II because the donations from Lions for the original Campaign Sight First are nearly depleted and blindness will double by 2020 unless action is taken now.

The Melvin Jones Program Mission Statement: To create and foster a spirit of understanding among all people for humanitarian needs by providing voluntary services through community involvement and international cooperation.

Lions responding to natural disasters through LCIF mobilized \$15,000,000 for relief and reconstruction after the tsunami devastation South Asia. Hundreds of homes have been built in Indonesia, Sri Lanka, India. and Thailand and construction still continues.

Through LCIF \$5,000,000 for Hurricane Katrina relief was raised and the service continues through Lions Clubs in the areas with help from, and twinning with, Clubs from other areas.

Altogether in fiscal year 2005, LCIF made 506 grants totaling \$30.7 million. Lions and LCIF are making a difference in millions of lives.
