Mr. Johnson reported he is a Special Investigator working with the Disabled and Senior Citizens and Identity Theft. Did you know it takes six months to a year to correct Identity Theft? You must report Identity Theft to the Credit Bureau, Federal Trade Commission, Credit Card Companies and your Bank. It's a good idea to get an Identity Passport. Included were several timely tips about

handling identity theft: Never carry your social security card. Never accept a phone solicitation for money or lotteries won. Never give money over the phone for the IRS, foreign aid or Police Associations. This even applies to emails. In addition there are four steps to help protect your identity: Protect your wallets/purses. Leave your social security card at home. Keep Debit cards in safe place. Get an Identity Theft Passport.
