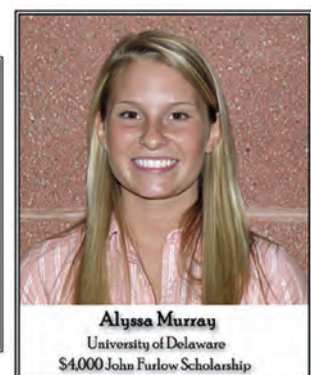


FILC Scholarship Winners:
