## Vision Screening

One of the incredibly important services we provide annually to our surrounding communities is a youth vision screening program that tests for childhood vision disorders, including amblyopia, or "lazy eye." Amblyopia affects how the brain processes unequal or abnormal visual input from the eyes and it is widely recognized that if it is caught early enough it is treatable.

This fall, under the direction of Jim and Carol Miles, the Fenwick Island Lions team completed screening at 10 separate schools, viewing some 532 children and had 140 referrals for further review. If that were not enough, Jim & Carol also orchestrated a training session on a Saturday in September at which Lions from other clubs had an opportunity to become proficient in the use of the new digital <u>Welch Allyn SureSight Vision Screener.</u>

Congratulations and our thanks go out to Jim & Carol, as well as Joe Leonard, his wonderful wife, Margret Ann, Dave Crum, Ash Ashinhurst, Sam & Muriel Mooney, Ray Hamm, and our newest Lion, Lee Summerville. In October, this dedicated group spent over 300 hours doing these screenings. Yet another wonderful example of Lions making a difference!

### The Fenwick Island State Park is Given a Wheelchair

At our regular meeting on October 3<sup>rd</sup> we were pleased to welcome Superintendent of Delaware Seashore State Parks, Doug Long, as well as Fenwick Island State Park Manager, Rosetta Grimm as our guests and our speakers for the day. Earlier, when our Club became aware that the park was in need of a wheelchair suitable for beach use, our board approved its acquisition and recommended that we apply to the Delaware Lions Foundation to help defray half the cost. We used the luncheon occasion to present the wheelchair to Mr. Long and Ms. Grimm.

Situated between the popular resort towns of Bethany Beach to the north and Fenwick Island and Ocean City to the south, Fenwick Island State Park is a relaxing escape from the summer crowds. This three-mile stretch of barrier island is a playground of sand, surf and sun along Delaware's Atlantic Coast, completely within the territory of the Fenwick Island Lions Club.

One of the newest features at the park is the modern bathhouse, which offers convenient showers and changing rooms, a gift shop, and a snack food concession. During the summer months, umbrellas, chairs, and rafts may be rented on the beach. Surfers can catch the big waves at Fenwick Island too, as the park has one of the few beaches in Delaware with a designated surfing area. The ocean beaches are also a favorite spot for surf fishing. Three dune crossings provide fishing access for vehicles with the proper permit to drive onto the beach. Surf fishing vehicle permits may be purchased at the bathhouse gift shop during the summer, or at the nearby park office at Delaware Seashore State Park.

Before the area became a park, the dynamic forces of nature constantly changed the narrow strip of barrier dunes between the Atlantic Ocean and Little Assawoman Bay, keeping the area wild and undeveloped. The area that is Fenwick Island State Park remained largely undisturbed, even as the towns of Bethany Beach and Fenwick Island were established. In 1926, a statewide survey classified the

park area as public lands, which were soon assigned to the state Highway Department. Later, during World War II, the park lands were used as part of Delaware's coastal defense system. A concrete observation tower from the war era still stands near the northern boundary of the park.

In 1966, the property was assigned to the State Park Commission as a southern section of Delaware Seashore State Park. The area was renamed Fenwick Island State Park in 1981, and is now managed in conjunction with Holts Landing State Park, on the nearby Indian River Bay, where we have our annual Club picnic.


